

In 2005, Simon's Heart emerged following the heartbreaking loss of 3-month-old Simon Sudman to Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA). Since then, we've screened 18,796 hearts, trained 250,000 in CPR, deployed 400+ AEDs, educated 1.8M coaches and athletes, and influenced legislation in 17 states. THANK YOU for your support!

ADVOCACY

In March 2023, we joined the Smart Heart Coalition in partnership with the NFL + launched the Access to AEDs Act. Together with Damar Hamlin, we're advocating for the widespread availability of AEDs where children learn and play. In September 2023, SCA survivors and advocates met

with PA Senate and House leaders, along with Gov. Shapiro, to introduce SB-375. This vital legislation aims to support the installation of AEDs on fields across Pennsylvania.
